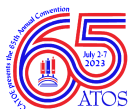
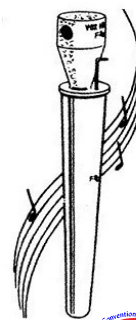
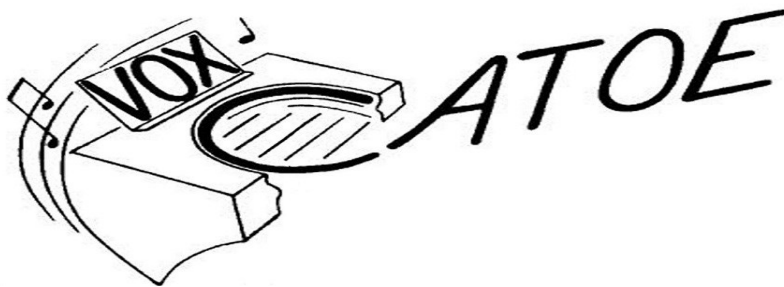

There were many layers of paint that were removed. The "birds" and the sun are being re-created to be more durable. The restoration team will put on a base coat before spraying the console red—which you can see was the original color. Side one should be finished with the paint removal this week. Then we can start on side 2. After both are completed, we will start repainting.

The pedals are in the JATOE work shop and are being cleaned, painted and restored. The bench is also being worked on.

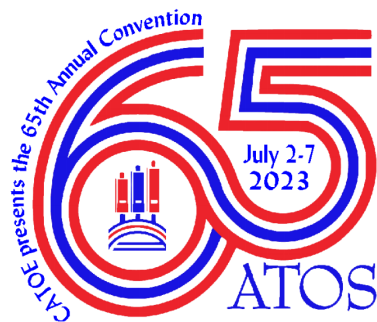
